Breakfast Club

Breakfast Club continues to be well supported with the children receiving a really good, healthy breakfast. We were sorry to have to increase the cost, but I am sure that you will agree that the breakfast is well worth the money. There is no need to pre-book your child in for breakfast club, you can just turn up and pay on the day.

- Parents MUST leave their children after registering them with the adult leader, not stay to help their children serve their breakfast. THIS IS A SAFEGUARDING ISSUE. I am sure, along with us, you all want your children to remain safe in our school.

Breakfast club starts at 7.45am and ends at 8.30am when the children are escorted to their classrooms by a member of the breakfast club team in time for registration. Breakfast is £1.50 each day and 50p for children in receipt of Free School Meals. If you think you may be entitled to Free School Meals, even if your child is in Early Years or KS1, then please speak to a member of the Admin Team who will be only too pleased to help.

SAFETY FIRST!

We have been experiencing some problems with our automatic gates over the past few days, and would ask parents to be patient if they don't get a response to the gate intercom immediately. A member of the Admin team will either try to get the intercom working, or will come out to open the gate. We have to keep the gates locked during the school day for security reasons.

- On the subject of safety, can we please remind parents that they should not park on the yellow lines outside of the school at any time or take a short cut through the staff car park into school. Staff are not expecting parents and children to be walking in the car park as they enter school or are maybe pulling into a parking space. There could very easily be an accident. We have seen a few people entering breakfast club this way. To ensure the safety of your children, please be sure to use the pedestrian gates which lead on to the pathways. Thank you.

ATTENDANCE

Well done to R Conkers, first week back and they achieved 100% attendance. A great start. They were closely followed by 2 Hazel who achieved 99.5% attendance.
