We were able to raise a fantastic £357.93 for Crisis (this was for the collections after the School Performances) and £248.76 for Save the Children (this was for Christmas Jumper Day on the last day of term). Ticket sales for the children's performances raised over £400.00 – this paid for all of the children's Christmas parties and went a long way to helping Santa with his presents for everyone! ## ATTENDANCE

Well done to 5 Elm who were our stars during the last week of term. They achieved 98.7% attendance, closely followed by 6 Chestnut with 97.2% and 4 Eucalyptus with 97.1% - 2 Hazel achieved 96.3% - well done to all of those classes.

Classes not quite making our overall school target of 96% were:

The school achieved 94.2% attendance overall, missing our target of 96%.

## PUNCTUALITY

During the week ending 8 December, your children's punctuality had improved by 50% with the children losing 6 hours and 55 minutes learning time. Unfortunately, during the week ending 15 December, a massive 16 hours and 40 minutes learning time was lost.
